



- Drive steadily accelerating slowly and braking gently – this can reduce your fuel costs by up to one third
- Switch off your vehicle when not in use (e.g. outside shops)
- Remove your roof rack when you're not using it to reduce drag, and take heavy items out of your car if they are not needed
- Share your car by offering lifts to neighbours or colleagues
- Only use air conditioning when you really need it
- Plan your route before you set out, so you don't waste time and fuel by getting lost. Buying a satellite navigation system may actually save you money on fuel
- Check your tyre pressure - under-inflated tyres create more friction and make your car less efficient
- Try to combine trips, as a warm engine is more fuel-efficient
